Communication to doctors

A pilot project is being carried out for the time period between 7th and 30th September 2023 to enable enhanced surveillance, notification, and fast-tracked referral to specialist GU care where necessary. This includes GPs in both the private and the public health sector. During this time, enhanced STI surveillance will be in place is going to be in place through the <u>form</u> provided below.

Surveillance will include instances where HIV post-exposure prophylaxis may need to be prescribed in accordance with the risk assessment guideline which accompanies this communication. This is currently available only upon prescription from 2 pharmacies in community settings (St. Julian's Pharmacy-Raltegravir; Floriana Dispensary-Dolutegravir; and Regional Pharmacy Msida). Notification of Infectious Diseases to Public Health

In Malta there are currently 73 notifiable infectious diseases that are statutorily notifiable.

Notification is mandatory by law for all doctors in both public and private sectors.

It is of great importance that the Infectious Disease Prevention and Control Unit (IDCU) is alerted as soon as possible whenever a patient presents with a notifiable infectious disease so that prompt public health action can be taken.

ENSURE that the following case details are collected and <u>verified as correct</u> during the clinical encounter:

- Name and Surname
- ID card Number/Hospital number (F number) /Passport number (for tourists)
- Contact Number
- Address they are currently staying in
- Email address

Specific scenarios of note

It is especially important that you urgently notify IDCU to allow for an immediate and effective Public Health response when encountering the following:

- Suspected/Confirmed Food-borne Illness
 - Cluster of cases of gastroenteritis due to food-poisoning
 - Gastroenteritis linked to a particular event (ex. Wedding, group event, gathering)
 - Scombrotoxin food-poisoning
- Outbreaks of infectious diseases in Institutions (ex. in homes for the elderly, schools or nurseries)
- Suspected/Confirmed bacterial meningitis
- Vector-borne infections (eg. Malaria, Dengue, Chikungunya, West Nile, Yellow fever, Zika etc).
 - In such cases, please obtain travel history from patient and take the required tests
 /refer for admission to Mater Dei Hospital as necessary

• Measles, Mumps or Rubella

- o Please gather details on vaccination history
- o Take tests: IgM, IgG, PCR as necessary to confirm diagnosis
- Give the patients the following advice:
 - Isolate at home immediately
 - Do not go to school/work, do not attend events
 - Wash hands frequently. If soap and water are not available, use an alcoholbased hand rub that contains at least 60% alcohol.
 - Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve when coughing or sneezing.
 - Avoid sharing utensils, water bottles or other items contaminated by saliva or respiratory secretions.
 - Patient should wait until being contacted by IDCU for further advice.

Suspected active TB

 If patient has suggestive X-Ray changes and is symptomatic, alert IDCU consultant on-call and arrange for ambulance to immediately transfer patient to MDH so they are not lost to follow-up and get the appropriate treatment.

Monkeypox

- GU clinic. (For queries regarding Monkeypox the Community ID service can be accessed through a dedicated pager **79703525**, Mon to Friday from 8am till 1pm, Saturday 8am till midday.)
- Anyone examining a suspected case of Monkeypox should wear the appropriate PPEs: mask/N95, visor, gloves, gown. Areas where the patient had direct contact should be decontaminated with a chlorine-based disinfectant or a proprietary product possessing virucidal properties.
- Refer urgently to GU clinic for diagnosis and management. For queries regarding Monkeypox the Community ID service can be accessed through a dedicated pager 79703525, Monday to Friday from 8am till 1pm, Saturday 8am till midday)
- Give the patients the following advice:
 - Advise the patient to isolate with immediate effect
 - Patient should wait until being contacted by IDCU for further advice.
